Hub World is present in 18 cities in 4 continents.

WHY ATLANTA?

Named “the fastest-growing city in America” by Forbes, Atlanta is a natural hub in the southeastern U.S. with an enormous movement of people, business, projects, and ideas. The city is now home to more than 5.5 million people, as well as the Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport, which transports about 90 million people each year. With 7500 nonprofit organizations, Atlanta was named the new nonprofit Mecca.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT THE HUB IS LOOKING FOR?

Vision:

The Atlanta Hub is a membership model that provides a flexible and creative work environment for socially minded people in Atlanta. It was established by those who believe in the power of community and in their ability to make a positive difference in the world. By providing an environment that is driven by the imagination of its participating members, the Atlanta Hub becomes a sustainable space for learning, sharing resources, gaining inspiration, forming connections, and moving ideas into action.

Function:

Financial: Build a membership model that leverages the space for co-working and events.

Environmental: Limit the carbon footprint of each member through co-working.

Social: Create solutions and interactions that benefit the community.

Membership is tiered and provides a wide range of benefits based on individual needs. As part of the membership strategy, Workspaces come in all shapes and functions, and we also provide meeting spaces, full kitchen, café, wireless internet, a library of progressive or project presentations, and most importantly, a community of people to learn from and share with. Beyond work, the Hub is also a catalyst for educational growth and cultural enrichments. We host events, such as business meetings; art exhibitions; film screenings; high-profile speakers and lectures; workshops; interdisciplinary labs; educational meals; music-making; stuff-swapping; and think tanks.

Prices are set monthly and are tracked with a “fob” key ring system:

Atlanta Hub 5 \$25: Five (5) hours/month usage of co-working space.

Atlanta Hub 25 \$75: Twenty-five (25) hours/ month usage; one (1) hour of conference room usage.

Atlanta Hub 50 \$150: Fifty (50) hours/month usage; two (2) hours of conference room usage.

Atlanta Hub 100 \$300: One Hundred (100) hours/month usage with a shared desk; four (4) hours of conference room usage; one (1) free sponsored mixer/yr.

Atlanta Hub unlimited \$450: Unlimited access with full-time desk, locker and access key; six (6) hours of conference room usage; one (1) free sponsored mixer.

Additional Benefits: a) Conference Room time can be purchased at \$15 per hour and available to non-members on a per case basis; b) Event Space is available to members for \$75 per hour. Non-members will be reviewed on a per case basis.
